## ABOUT HATCH HOUSE SUMMER CAMP

Come join us at *Camp Hatch House School 2018*.

**Camp Philosophy:** Hatch House Summer Camp is a blend of traditional summer camp activities, field trips and guest presenters. Campers explore new and exciting theme based activities while we sneak in, *aka* reinforce, basic classroom skills (writing, reading and math) based on the theme of the week. Our camp also provides a low teacher to camper ratio, fun curriculum themes, field trips, and guest visitors. The camp is primarily geared towards children who have completed Kindergarten through 5th grade. Daily camp activities are held at the Hatch House School building. Camp Hatch House will provide a memorable and meaningful summer experience with a smaller group, in an engaging and safe environment.

**Staff:** All camp staff are experienced and undergo Department of Family and Protective Services background checks, and FBI fingerprinting checks in addition to being CPR/First-Aid certified.

**Hatch House School is licensed by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services to provide care for children who are infants to school-aged children.**

## WEEKLY CAMP THEMES

**Week 1: Incredible Me:** This week we are focusing on the incredible super fantastic you! This is the week where we meet all of our new summer camp friends and learn about our differences and similarities and how to work as a team. We will make a book about You, visit the park, and have splash day.

**Week 2: The Great Outdoors:** This week we are taking advantage of the great outdoors. We will have an action packed week with a nature hike, and stay active playing sports outdoors. If you like outdoor sports and games and being in nature, then this is the camp for you.

**Week 3: Space Explorers:** This week we are looking into space for some solar fun. How much do you know about our solar system, or the stars that fill the night sky? Are you interested in space travel, astronauts and space ships and the science of space? then get ready to learn about space.

**Week 4: Beach Party:** This weeks theme is the beach and having fun in the water and the sun! Have you ever been to the beach or the sea? What kinds of sea life did you see, what did you enjoy most about being at the beach? In this week we will learn about beaches and why they are not only for having fun but also a very important environmental resource. At the end of the week we will have a beach party.

**Week 5: Food Network Kids Cooking:** Do you enjoy learning about cooking tasty, easy, kid-friendly meals? Are you a budding junior chef? In this camp we will mix, mold and make summertime foods and refreshing drinks. We will learn about cooking terms, measurements and recipes.

**Week 6: Talent Show -Hocus Pocus:** This week we are learning about magic and the performance of magic tricks. We will learn about magical potions, famous magicians and how to perform magic tricks. At the end of the week we will showcase some of our newly learned tricks.

**Week 7: Fun with Fairytales:** This week we are all about Fairytales. Have you ever thought of making a fairytale have a different ending or beginning? Students will make props, learn to speak on stage, write lines, and perform a unique fairytale show at the end of the week.

**Week 8: We Love Texas:** Campers will explore and learn all about the city of Austin, Texas. They will visit local attractions, and generally learn about the history, geography and life in our “keeping it weird” city.

**Week 9: Secret Agents in Training:** Have you ever wanted to be a secret agent? This week we will learn how to review fingerprints, how to send information in code, and how to make a disguise. Throughout the week the campers will learn to pay attention to the details that make a super detective.

**Week 10: International Week:** This week we are learning all about our closest neighbors to the South. We will learn Spanish vocabulary, make Mexican foods, listen to Mexican music and dance, and finish the week with a Mexican Fiesta.

**Week 11: Hatch House Olympics:** This week will be action packed week of fun and fitness for kids who enjoy being active. Campers will play sports and games, practice their ball handling and foot-work skills, including dribbling, and running; at the end of the week we will have an Olympics award ceremony.

**Week 12: Back to School Countdown:** This week we are looking ahead to the start of school, yeah! The activities are designed to help prepare your child and spark their excitement for the first day of school. Good-bye summer.

## What to Bring

All campers should bring a water bottle filled with cold water, sunscreen, wear closed toed shoes, and comfortable clothing. The teachers will inform parents on the days campers need to bring anything special, like a swim suit or sack lunch. Please label all of your children's belongings so that they make it home at the end of the day. Please don't send any toys, electronic games, or money unless requested to do so. Please do not send your child to school with any items that are irreplaceable.

## Behavioral Expectations

Campers are expected to behave appropriately at all times. Hatch House School reserves the right to cancel or dismiss a child's enrollment at anytime, at its sole discretion. We also reserve the right to not enroll a child whose behaviors or needs we are unable to meet if we deem such action to be in the best interest of the child and/or school.

## Health Considerations

If a camper encounters a health problem during the day, we will immediately notify the parent/guardian. If you cannot be reached, we will contact the emergency contacts listed on the registration form. If your child has any preexisting medical conditions or medications that require daily administration please notify the Director prior to enrollment. All allergy medications and physician directives must be provided upon enrollment.

Should you need to contact your child during the day, please call the school office.

## Registration & Tuition Fees

**Registration and Field Trips Fee:** \$100 (non-refundable registration fee due upon enrollment).

**Weekly Tuition Fee: \$195 per week session\* full-time, Monday to Friday** Registration and tuition fees must be received in advance so that we can plan for the upcoming week. Lunch, morning snack and afternoon snack are included. Some field trips may require a sack lunch from home or parent-pay take-out restaurant meals depending on the week.

\* The only exception to the weekly tuition is **the last week of camp which is only 3 days** (Monday August 13 through Wednesday August 15). Tuition for this last 3 days of camps is a DAILY fee of \$40 per day.

**Specialized Enrichment Programs:** A separate fee may be required to participate in specialized programs from outside enrichment vendors (for example Drones, or Karate etc.).

**Please select camps carefully. Camp tuition fees are NOT refundable. Parents are financially responsible for the camps they have selected.**
